Basic Question Words in Spanish

Forming Yes/No Questions

Inversion of Subject and Verb

One common method to form yes/no questions is by inverting the order of the subject and the verb. For example, the statement “Tú hablas español” (You speak Spanish) becomes “¿Hablas tú español?” (Do you speak Spanish?). This inversion signals a question, especially when accompanied by rising intonation.

Intonation Only

In casual spoken Spanish, yes/no questions can sometimes be formed by simply raising the intonation at the end of a declarative sentence, without changing the word order. For example, “¿Tú hablas español?” with a rising pitch indicates a question.

Using Question Marks

Spanish utilizes inverted question marks at the beginning and regular question marks at the end of a

question, such as “¿Hablas español?” This punctuation is crucial for identifying questions in written Spanish and aids in proper intonation during reading.

Using Question Tags

Question tags are short questions added to the end of a statement to confirm information or seek agreement. While less common in Spanish than in English, they still play a role in informal conversation and are part of muchas preguntas.

Indirect Questions

Note that indirect questions do not use question marks and the verb-subject order remains that of a declarative sentence.

Common Mistakes When Forming Questions
