Following that, there are moments when positive reinforcement is the worst option possible. We all want our puppy to grow up to be a social dog, able to play and interact with other dogs, animals, and humans. As such, a nice way of making steps towards this goal is exposing the puppy to other people and animals from a young age. This does not mean to throw them into a dog day care without any guidance; it means scheduling early play dates with other dogs or inviting people over to meet the pup. The dog may have moments of apprehension where it will feel timid and frightened of other dogs. It is important not to coddle puppies in these situations, as much as you want to. You are simply reinforcing the withdrawing behavior that with psychologically disconnect them from their own species. Pacing Let puppies discover the world at their own pace. Upset the balance a little by moving furniture around and provide learning opportunity by exposing them to certain stimuli that they will regularly experience (other dogs, vacuum cleaners, the outdoors, etc.), but never force their natural curiosity.
