Puppies are notorious for having accidents when excited or nervous. These moments are a bad time for negative reinforcement because they do not realize what they are doing, they cannot comprehend that they have had an accident. Negative reinforcement in this situation will serve only to instill a fear in them that they cannot connect with any behavior, which will result in long term

phobias. Following that, there are moments when positive reinforcement is the worst option possible. We all want our puppy to grow up to be a social dog, able to play and interact with other dogs, animals, and humans. As such, a nice way of making steps towards this goal is exposing the puppy to other people and animals from a young age. This does not mean to throw them into a dog day care without any guidance; it means scheduling early play dates with other dogs or inviting people over to meet the pup. The dog may have moments of apprehension where it will feel timid and frightened of other dogs. It is important not to coddle puppies in these situations, as much as you want to. You are simply reinforcing the withdrawing behavior that with psychologically disconnect them from their own species. Pacing Let puppies discover the world at their own pace. Upset the balance a little by moving furniture around and provide learning opportunity by exposing them to certain stimuli that they will regularly experience (other dogs, vacuum cleaners, the outdoors, etc.), but never force their natural curiosity. Give them the opportunity for growth and a puppy will do it on their own. Always remember that, for a young puppy, it is always best to take experiences in sprints. Puppies require a lot of sleep and naps, and they tend to tire out quite easily. Take the puppy for a short walk through the park rather than a long hike. Or on a car ride to the post office for a guick drop off rather than an extended car ride on a vacation. A puppy experiences and learns more if it is well rested and handles it in bursts, it's just how they learn. Model experiences that way. Dog Day Care Dog day care isn't usually a good option for a newborn puppy. What IS an extremely viable option, if you simply not have the time to properly do it yourself, is a puppy training program.
