## PSYCHOLOGICAL MECHANISMS BEHIND IMAGINATION INFLATION

Imagination inflation occurs partly because individuals may misattribute the source of their imagined scenarios, confusing them for real memories. This misattribution leads to an inflated confidence that the imagined event truly happened.

#### FAMILIARITY AND REPEATED IMAGINATION
