Solution: These are independent events because the coin flip does not affect the die roll. Probability of heads is 1/2, and probability of rolling a 4 is 1/6. Multiply these: $(1/2) \times (1/6) = 1/12$.

Problem: A card is drawn from a standard deck, replaced, and then a second card is drawn. What is the probability both cards drawn are aces?

Solution: Since the card was replaced, the events are independent. Probability of drawing an ace is 4/52 = 1/13. The probability for both draws is $(1/13) \times (1/13) = 1/169$.
