An extensive glossary of more than 5,000 terms, accessible from anywhere in the course companion, allows students to click on a term and hear it pronounced in English or Spanish. Students can also choose to hear the definitions translated into Spanish. Linked glossary terms within the course narrative enable students to hear each term pronounced correctly. Spanish translations of glossary terms and definitions better equip students to communicate with non-English speakers and with those for whom English is a second language. Hypertext links direct students to related website resources for further study. A self-scoring Self-Mastery Quiz at the end of each module allows students to test their comprehension and recognition before taking the Self-Mastery Exam, which is automatically graded and reported to the instructor.

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
