SOME PROGRAMS MAY ALSO REQUIRE INTERVIEWS OR WRITING SAMPLES TO ASSESS APPLICANTS' COMMUNICATION SKILLS AND ANALYTICAL ABILITIES. PART-TIME AND ONLINE OPTIONS ARE INCREASINGLY AVAILABLE, PROVIDING FLEXIBILITY FOR WORKING PROFESSIONALS.
