From Poverty to the Pentagon is an autobiographical account of Robert Williams Jr. as he rose from

His infectious personality encouraged many to cross these invisible boundaries, and long-lasting friendships were formed. Robert's intent is for the reader to be inspired to have faith, believe in self, and realize that anyone can achieve anything with drive, determination, and a desire to rise above stereotypical expectations.
