In my 34 years at TAMU, I taught more than 13,000 students and supervised more than 300 graduate teaching assistants. I taught courses in agricultural ethics, history of farming in the Great Plains, world food and fiber crops, sustainable crop production, agricultural extension, and international agricultural development. My research areas were the interaction of crops and weeds, biological nitrogen fixation, and the distribution of the products of photosynthesis within plants. I am now retired. In this book I show how deeply my teaching and understanding of life was affected by these young Native Americans.
